Daughter Elizabeth Elborn a trunk of Linen in the Chamber over the Parlour
and a copper beater and the biggest brass kettle and no more of the Copper nor Brass
but one part in three of all the rest of my household stuff to be divided between my
good Daughter and my two male issue & my wife Elizabeth Elborn in her life time

and from of late age I have been very ill and
now am of no use living. I hope you will give my
last regards to all our friends and tell them of our blessing. Also we give you my
last regards to my wife Eliza a trunk of Linen in the Chamber over the Pewter
and Pewter box and the biggest brass kettle and no more of the copper nor brass
tins nor nothing else of all the rest of my household stuff to be divided between my
good daughter and my loving wife Margaret and my son William each one to choose

I wan to divide the said Household stuff equally into three parts my Wife to take one part
my Son one part and my Daughter another part without bras or copper & like money
unto my said loving Wife the sume of four pound per year to be paid by my Executor
hereafter named out of the Estate I now divide in during her natural life or else to
her sufficient meat drink washing and lodging with whom which of Nature herself shall
best to do I give unto my Son William Elborn whom I make sole Executord of this my
last Will and Testamant and I give unto him and his heirs all
and every my Lents and Tenements and hereditaments whatsoever and wheresoever
which I also charge with the payment of the said Legacies above named At the same
Time whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 13th day of March
1720/1 (Wm Elborn) Sign'd sealed published and declared by the abovesigned testator
