presently day of May in the ffifteth yere of the Reigne of our sover-  
aigne lord James of England ffirmer and Feilder And of Scotlande the  
ffiftieth by the grace of god Kinge defender of the faith etc Anno Domini  
1603 Robert Fuller of Doggeshall in the Countie of Essex clothier being  
sick and weake of body but of good memorye, thanke be unto god, doe make  
and ordaine this my present testiment and last will in manner and forme  
followinge That I do say first and principally I commend my soule unto  
almightie god my creator and mercifull father Ihesus xpus by whose  
death and resurrection I doe hope and beleve to be made partaker of ever-  
lastinge life And I commit my bodie to the earth whereof it is formed to be  
buried by the discretions of myne Excutors hereafter named And as touching  
the disposinge of such worldly goodes as it hath pleased god to bestow upon me  
in this life and to make me none the disposer thereof my will and mynde is to  
distribute and dispose of the same in manner and forme as followeth First I give  
and bequeath unto my lovinge Father Thomas Fuller the somme of Com-  
pounde of lawfull money of England And unto Alice Clarke my sister the  
somme of three pounde of like English money And to my sister Elizabeth  
wife of John Eswell And to my sister Marie the wife of William Spence  
one each of them twenty shillinge of like money these Legacies to be paid  
within six monethes next after my decesse Item I give and bequeath  
to my daughter Straughton fourtie shillinge of lawfull money of England Item I  
give and bequeath unto the poore people of Doggeshall aforesaid the somme  
of fortie shillinge to be distributed at the tyme of my buriall by the discre-  
tion of myne Excutors Item I give and bequeath unto every one of my next  
of kin which now do worke with me each of them xx shillinge Item I give and  
bequeath unto John Eswell unto whose house I have gyven possession before in  
this my will Item I give and bequeath unto Sara my daughter the somme  
of one hundred pounde of lawfull money of England to be payed unto her  
at her age of eightene yeres or day of marriage which shall first happen  
Item I give unto Thomas my apprentice xx shillinge of lawfull money  
Item I give and bequeath unto Anne my lovinge wife All and singuler my  
householdstuff and ymplementes of householdstuffe within the house the rest  
and residue of all and singuler my goodes wearres hares woodd yarens debtyd  
money and other thinges appertaininge to my stock or beinge parcell thereof  
my Legacies beinge deduced my ffirmitie expens beinge discharged and all  
manner of charges in any manner of wyse touching or concerninge the same  
will and Testament of is my will mynde and meaning And I doe hereby  
revoke give and dispose all the said residue or surplus to be divided into three  
even and equall partes whereof I doe will give and bequeath one of the said  
thre partes unto my said wife And one other thre partes thereof unto Robert  
Fuller my eldres sonne And likewise the other thre partes thereof unto the  
said my sonne to be payed unto either of them my said sonnes at their severall  
ages of one and twentie yeres And further it is my will mynde and mean-  
inge that if either of my said three sonnes Robert or Thomas or the said  
Sara my daughter shall die and departe this life before their portions shall  
be due unto them that then the parte or partes of him her or them so departinge
