Item I doe give and bequeath to my Cousin Elliot Sterland the somme of Six pouldes
 thirtene shillings and fouer pence. Item I doe give and bequeath to every one of my
 godchildren within the Countie of Darbie five shillings a peece. Item my will is that my
 body be comely buried within the Church of Chigwell and so give and bequeath to Mr
 Harvey the Curate there Tenne shillings to make a sermon at my funerall. Item I doe
 give and bequeath to Anne Decty for her diligence about me in the tyme of my
 sickness Tenne pouldes. Item I doe give and bequeath six pouldes thirtene shillings and
 fouer pence to be bestowed upon a banquet upon my fellow servants in the house. Item
 I doe give and bequeath unto the poore of the parish of Linton forty shillings and like-
 wise I doe give and bequeath unto the poore of the parish of Chigwell forty shillings
 to be distributed amongst them according to the discretion of the Churchwardens or
 together with the consent of my Executors. Item I doe give and bequeath unto goodwife
 Doperys goodwife Gybne Lettice ffurth Matthey Shelley and Agnes Holmes twenty
 shillings a peece and to Joane Herison Twenty shillings. Item I doe give and bequeath
 unto Wutbert Cooley the somme of twenty shillings. Item I doe give and bequeath
 unto Anthony Wylfey William Sydney and Humphrey Harrison either of them a sute
 of apparrell that is to say doublett and hose or thirtene shillings fouer pence a peece
 in monee. Item I doe give and bequeath unto Thomas Shelley the somme of forty
 shillings. Item I doe ordayne and appoynt William Harvey of Chigwell Clarke and
 William Dollard of Mansford Executors of this my last will and Testament. In
 witness whereof to this my last will and Testament I have sett my hande and
 scale this Seaventeenth day of November A Thousand Six hundred and eight.

 perfect sense and understanding doe make this my last will and Testament
 in writing. ffirst I commend my soule into the handes of Almighty god
 my maker and Jesus Christ his only sonne my onely sole redeemer and saviour
 through whose worke of mediation I have full assurance of Remission of all
 my synnes and to lyve in glory everlasting. My body to be comely buried at the
 discretion of my Executors. And for the disposing and plarng of my landes &
 Tenements possessions goodes and Chattells such as God of his goodnes hath
 blessed me with in this life I will of them as hereafter followeth. ffirst I
 give unto Elizabeth fuller my wellbelovd wief my capitall Messnage robes
 I purchast of one William Butler Esquie^r stryuate in Weststrate over against

The marriage in the occupation of one John Clement with the yards and easements there
 with now ased to hold to my sayd wife and her Assignes during the terme of her lieif
 And she to keepe it in Tenantlike Reparation and to be to her for and in full satisfaction
 of her dowry and thunders which she hath or may have unto any other my landes or tenement
 which I was solie seised of during the coverture betwene us And I give more unto her
 Threescore penny of lawfull English money to be payd unto her within eight monethes
 after my death by my Exors to be And I give her all my household stuff (such parrells as I
 shall hereafter dispose of only excepted) All which gifts to my sayd wife are and shall be
 to her upon this condition That she within fewer monethes after my death and upon
 lawfull request to her made shall make a good and perfect Release of her dowry and thing
 which she may have and clayme to have to any my landes and Tenements which I made
 solie seised of during the coverture unto such of my children and their heires as shall be
 Tenant of the freehold or inheritance of the same according unto such their estates in the
 same Item I give unto Robert my Sonne after my wives death the parrells of household
 following The Table in my parlor Twelve honyed stools One Court table in the parlor
 One long Table with a frame in the hall And one livery cupboard the which parrells
 have of long tyme stood in my house Item I give unto my Sonne Danyell my two messuages
 or Tenements which I purchased of the sayd William Butler which by on thone syde of
 my sayd Capitall or great Messuage in Weststrate formerly given to my wife for my
 thest To hold the sayd Tenements and premises with thappurtenances to the sayd
 Danyell my Sonne for and during his naturall lieif The remainder after his death
 to his first Sonne and to the heires males of his body lawfully begotten And for
 default of such issue to his second Sonne and to the heires males of his body
 lawfully begotten And for default of such issue to his third Sonne and to the
 heires males of his body lawfully begotten And for default of such issue to his

 lieif The remainder to his first Sonne and thheires males of his body lawfully begotten
 with thremainders over of such estate and estates as I have formerly appoynted of other
 my sayd Tenements to my Sonne Danyell hereby given Item I give and bequeath unto
 Danyell my Sonne Twenty penny of lawfull English money to be payd unto him by mine
 Exors to be within six monethes after my death (if he be then in life) And if he be
 dead Then I will thone half thereof to be payd unto his wife within six monethes
 after my death And thother half unto William his Sonne at his age of One and twenty
 if he so long live) and if he dye before and have brethren or sisters then to be divided
 equally betwene them or so many of them as shall live to such ages Item I give
 unto Zachary my Sonne Thirtie penny to be payd to be payd unto him within one yeare
 after my death Item I give unto Jeremy my Sonne my sayd Capitall and great messuage
 lying in Weststrate after the death of my wife To hold to him and his heires after

the death of my said wife. Item I give unto the sayd Jeremy certayn land lying in ffloermy
which I purchasid of William Butler Esq^r called or knowne by the name of the Downes
or by what other name To hold to the sayd Jeremy and his heyres for ever. Item I give the
Rent and money to me reserved and payable yearly, which is Threestore ^{penny} and fyve
shillings de clavo yearly out of certayn lease-landes called Erigged for the first seven
yeares of the terme to come after my death unto Jeremy my some for the making of one
stock in money for hym. And ys happen that the lease and interest of me in Erigged lease
not to prove good in lawe and to be avoyded, Then I will the one half benefitt of One
obligation or dedde obligatory to me made and entred in to for my enjoynyng the sayd terme
(the half part of the charges in lawe deducted) unto my the sayd Jeremy my some for the end
afore sayd. And I will and my mynde is That my Executo^r shall immediately after
my death lett and sett the Tenements and landes given to my sayd Some Jeremy in possession
and after my wives death (ys my some Jeremy be not then of fyve and Twenty yeares
of age) and shall like wise lett and sett the Capitall Messuage to hym given and therof
shall take the profitts and rents and shall receive the rent and money given to my sayd
Some out of Erigged lease And I will that such monies by them receyved shall be by
my sayd Executo^r well and honestly employed to thuse of my sayd Some Jeremy until
thage of fyve and Twenty yeares by my sayd Some accomplished At which age I will that
a first attempt of all the Arrears made by my sayd Executo^r of the rents and monyes
afore sayd shall be made to my sayd Some Jeremy And that then my Executo^r authoritie
shall cease for receipt or intermeddling with the landes or rents any further and that
the monyes by them in the meane tyme receyved shall be truly payd unto my some Jeremy
at his age of fyve and Twenty yeares. And ys my some Jeremy dye before such age
Then I will the Tenements and landes given to hym to remaine to my right heyres.
And I will out of such rents and monyes receyved by my sayd Executo^r shall be given
to my three somes Robert Dargell and Zachary ys they shall be in liess at the death of
Jeremy he dying before thage afore sayd for to so many of them as shall be then in liess to
either of them the somme of ffower store penny of lawfull money of England. And
I will that all my daughters (ys Jeremy dye as afore sayd) or to so many of them as
shall be then in liess shall have payd to them out of such rents and receipts the somme of
Threestore pence apiece And ys it happen the sayd Terme to be expired from my
Executo^r so as they may not receive such rents as afore sayd Then I will that thone
half benefitt of the sayd Obligation afore appointed to my Some Jeremy ys Jeremy
dye before his sayd age of fyve and twenty yeares shall be employed to the performance
and payment of the sayd severall sommes of money hereby last mentioned and given
to my somes and daughters the half charges in suite of lawe for defence of my interest
in the terme and the recovery of thobligation alwayes deducted and allowed to my
Executo^r. And I will my daughters shall be first payd by my sayd Executo^r
theldest first and so in degree by birth as there shall be sufficient in my Executo^r
handes of such receipts of the rents and monyes afore sayd to pay them And after
them I will my sayd Somes shall be payd in like order by my sayd Executo^r.
And I will the surplus of such rents and monyes to be and remaine unto my some
Thomas Fuller. Item I give unto my some in lawe Nicholas Fuboth the somme
of Twenty and fyve penny the which I will shall be payd unto him within fower
monethes after my death. Item I give unto Robert Fuller my some and to his heyres
one parcell of lande lying at thupper end of Stoneham street towards market hall
called Ingre-downe alias the harpe upon condition that he conveye upon request
such estate as he hath or may have in one yard next walled now with John Starlings
house unto such persons and their heyres unto whom I have given the house
wherein the sayd Starling now dwelleth in. Item I give to Thomas my some and
to his heyres after the death of my sayd wife all those two messuages or tenements

with thappurtening wherem Thomas White and John Laurence now dwell in And these two
 apertes or partells of Customary or Copyhold Landes, Galsen of the maner of Menth et
 Dogge shall called Petteford and Wapstondy Ave Item I give and bequeath unto all my
 Grandchildren that shalbe living at the Day of my death ffentie Shillings a peere (William
 Fuller some of my Sonne Danyell only excepted) to be payd them at their severall ages of
 One and Twenty yeares or theye dayes of Maryage which first shall happen, yf they
 so long live. Item I give to William Fuller some of my Sonne Danyell Twenty pound
 to be payd him by my Exoruto^{rs} at his age of One and Twenty yeares (yf he live)
 Item I give to my good friend Mr Stoughton Minister of Dogge shall forty Shillings
 Item I give to my Sister Powndes and to my Sister Matson to either of them the
 somme of Twenty Shillings to be payd within thre monethes after my death yf
 they or either of them be then in liess. Item I will my wief shall have the use of my
 plate during her liess And after her death I give my covered pott of plate to
 my Sonne Thomas Fuller to Robert my Sonne my goblet of plate to Jeremy my
 Sonne my Sonne of plate to Elizabeth Hill my daughter fower of my silver spoons
 to Judith Shortland my daughter other fower And to Sara Fithold my daughter
 other fower the which I will shalbe delivered by my Exoruto^{rs} after the death
 of my wief. All the rest of my goodes Chattells and Watter plate Jewells
 Debty and ready money after sufficient allotted to the performanc of the generall
 legacies to be payd by my Exoruto^{rs} And my debty deducted and attempted I give
 unto Thomas Fuller my Sonne. Item I give to the poore of Dogge shall fyve
 pound to be given at my burvall by the direction of my Exoruto^{rs}. And I make
 Thomas Fuller my Sonne and Nicholas Fithold my Sonne in law Exoruto^{rs}
 of this my will and Testament Revoking all other And I appoynt Overseers
 of this my will and Testament Thomas Fuller of Stebbing and my Sonne in
 law Thomas Shortland And I give them for theyr paynes to either of them
 Twenty Shillings for a Remembrance. In witness wherof I have hereunto
 put my hand scule these being witnesses Thomas Fuller Robert Fuller
 William Fuller. And that Alice Fuller wief to my Sonne Danyell shall have
 for and during her naturall liess yf she happen to survive her sayd husband the
 foresayd two howses before given and bequeathed to her sayd husband by this
 my last will and Testament. William Fuller. This gift is to be added
 to the first page of the last will of the sayd William Fuller in the two and
 Twentieth lyne and was subscribed and delivered by the sayd William in the
 presence of those whose names are underwritten. Thomas Fuller J. Aarke
