Myne of bread taken to be virtully binned at the discretion of myne executor & in name  
 and appointed, Item myne of I gant grettofort & other into the same effect of trust my  
 lease of Carling Hall for the payment of a certain yearly sum to Thomas & my some  
 pppen condition that if Welland were my some more in name and not satisfied and paye  
 into me the some of five hundred pounds at a certain day in the said conveyance put  
 round as by the said conveyance more at large maye appear that the said yearly payment  
 should cease duringe his naturall life and the some of five hundred pounds was not paid  
 accordinge to the said conveyance and bequeste all the bent full of the said lease  
 and all other my leasdes goods and chattells whersoever to come myn owne towards the payment  
 of my debts and towards the bringinge ppp of my children, and my will and meaninge so  
 that the said sume myn owne shall paye into every of my younger sonnes viz John, Edward,  
 William, Robert, and Francis the some of four hundred pounds a pece out of the profitte  
 of my leasdes of Carling Hall and Mersy Hall as the said Hall yearly arise and growe,  
 and likewise to every of my daughters the some of two hundred pounds a pece, the said severall  
 sonnes to be payde to every of them as they shall growe in regard of years and accordinge  
 of age, and as the said maye be paid and retained out of the profitte of my said leasdes, Item  
 I doe will geve and bequeste unto the said sume myn owne and to the said myn owne in a  
 halfe acre of land in the parish of St. Dunstons in the city of London, to the intent that the said sume  
 should towards the payment of my debts, Item I doe ordayne and make the said sume myn  
 owne my full and sole executor of the said my last will and meaninge and I charge the said  
 the said my will be fully performed in all payde accordinge to the said meaninge of the said sume, In  
 witness whereof the said sume my last will and Testament I have subscribed with my hand and sealed the  
 daye and year first above written in the presence of the said Thomas & myn owne written, and  
 doth well amende to the said my will, Item I doe geve unto the said Thomas of the parish of St. Dunstons  
 the some of five hundred pounds to be distributed amongst them within one month after my decease  
 by the discretion of my said executor the said Thomas, sealed and delivered by the  
 said Thomas & myn owne as his last will and Testament and the said words, that the said  
 said payment should cease duringe his naturall life, and the said records (of the said lease)  
 were subscribed before the said sealinge and deliverye in the presence of us, John Warkenton  
 Clerk Simon & c.

**Memorandum** that about Easter in Anno Dni 1607, Richard  
 Hawley of St. Augustines near Pauls London beinge at that tyme sick and unable  
 in body and beinge moved by Mary Hawley to make his will he first wrote or  
 the like in effect meaninge thereby to geve his will and intention in that behalf  
 of my some Beazant were geve I would write some words, but seeinge he is not  
 geve my will is thus made for I make you my full executor speakinge to and meaninge  
 the said Mary his wife and I geve you all I have and will take nothinge from you and  
 beinge demanded by his wife whether his owne should have his pattenes  
 he answered I if he would, he was beinge then pnt in Courtley, M. Stope and  
 Thomas Hawley some of the foresaid Richard Hawley.
